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Experience Belonging with Fairlawn.

Experience Belonging volunteers get involved in activities where they lend a hand, establish meaningful connections or simply enjoy the company of other people.

As Experience Belonging Chair Allan Hux describes it, volunteers in various lay ministry teams “provide support and social activities where everyone can experience fellowship and friendship.”

As part of our Pastoral Visitation Team, they visit those who are experiencing loss or health issues, or who are no longer able to attend church regularly. New volunteers can join Need a Ride/Give a Ride and drive Fairlawners to and from medical appointments or to visit a spouse in hospital. Knitters are welcome

to participate in the Prayer Shawl Ministry and knit cozy shawls to comfort those in need as a reminder that they are not alone. Women in the community who have had or are undergoing treatment for breast cancer are invited to join the Breast Cancer Support Group which meets monthly to provide support, education and fellowship.

People looking for a shorter-term volunteer commitment can become part of a Helping Hands ad hoc group to provide temporary care such as support following a hospital stay or for a move. They can also assist with the June Visitation Tea for Fairlawn’s seniors or with the Post-Secondary Care Package

The Experience Belonging Ministry also includes volunteer-supported social activities that bring members, their friends and members of the community

together for fun and fellowship.

Everyone is welcome. Activities include the annual Fairlawn Book Sale (which marks its 58th year in 2019), Quilting, Knitting, Basketball, Advent by Candlelight, Tuesday Lunch Crowd, Noah Social Group, Young Women's Group, and The United Observer Discussion Group, among others.
