Dr. Lydia Adams

Lydia is an accomplished conductor and composer, widely recognized for her role in the growth of Canadian choral music. She studied music at Mount Allison University NB, the Royal College of Music and the National Opera Studio in the UK. Recipient of Choral Canada's Distinguished Service Award, she has collaborated and performed with leading conductors and composers in Canada and Internationally. Lydia received the honorary degree, Doctor of Letters, from Cape Breton University for her dedication "to the preservation and evolution of musical culture." Lydia recently concluded 35 years of leadership with the Amadeus Choir. This year, she celebrates her 25th year as Conductor and Artistic Director of the Elmer Iseler Singers.

Longtime colleague and friend of Eleanor's, Lydia's support of Fairlawn's Special Music and her participation today are very much appreciated.

Tom Allen

Tom Allen is a storyteller, trombonist, and writer, who has enriched arts and broadcasting in Canada for over 30 years. He studied at McGill and graduated with degrees in music from Boston and Yale universities. Tom was recently awarded Doctor of Letters, honoris causa, from Thompson River University. He has written three books and hosted shows for theatre companies and orchestras . Tom and his life partner, harpist Lori Gemmell also create and perform stage shows that mix music, history, and storytelling. With a long career at CBC, he currently hosts the Radio 2 show, "About Time".

A former Fairlawn choir member, both Tom and Lori have performed at Fairlawn on numerous occasions over the years.

Christopher Dawes is a conductor and consultant with many of Southern Ontario's top musical institutions. He serves as Organist and Director of Music to Rosedale Presbyterian Church, Collaborative Accompanist to the Orpheus Choir of Toronto, and Music Director of the acapella Marion Singers of Greater Toronto. He has served as Accompanist and Coach to graduate and undergraduate instrumental and choral conducting programs of the Faculty of Music, University of Toronto, and as a Director of Canada's Summer Institute of Church Music.

A frequent guest of Eleanor's special musical offerings at Fairlawn, and honoured to be here again today, Chris lives with his wife Marcia and their children in Georgetown, Ontario.

Willis Bote has been singing with the Senior Choir and generously sharing his abundant musical talents as a tenor section lead with Fairlawn since 2006. A conductor, vocal coach, and teacher, Willis holds a Master of Music degree from the University of Michigan, a Bachelor of Education from the University of Toronto and a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Western Ontario. Willis has been active in conducting, coaching and developing choral programs for young singers. He is currently a music teacher at Lawrence Park Collegiate Institute with the Toronto District School Board.
