Statement of Purpose

Return of Symbols of Ministry

When I came among you, to serve with you as an Intentional Interim Minister of Word, Sacrament, and Pastoral Care, you shared some symbols of ministry with me that I now return to you so that you may enter into a new covenant relationship:

Bible (placed on the Communion table)

The Bible is a symbol of the ministry of the Word among us.

May God's Word continue to challenge, nurture, and inspire us.

We will continue to place scripture at the centre of our life.

The Word of God lives among us. Thanks be to God.

Water (poured into the Baptismal font)

The font is the symbol of our baptism, the place of our new birth into Christ.

May you continue to welcome new members through the living waters of faith.

We will continue to celebrate new life in baptism:

the font of blessing welcomes all. Thanks be to God.

Bread and Cup (placed on the Communion table)

a source of nourishment and strength.

May you continue to share food, share life, and work for justice,
as a community of compassionate hospitality, diversity, and welcome.

The table is the symbol of our sharing of life in Christ,

We will continue to break the bread and share the cup.
The table invites us to taste and see God's abundance
together, with joy. Thanks be to God.

Towel and Basin (placed on the Communion table)

The towel and basin are symbols of our calling to justice and service, following the example of Jesus, who washed the feet of his friends. May you continue to walk and to serve in the way of Jesus.

We will continue to serve others and to work for justice, walking in the way of Jesus, with love. Thanks be to God.

If you would know,


even for a day,
