The Peace of the Christ Candle

Scripture Readings Psalm 19, Exodus 20:1-17 (The Inclusive Bible)

Psalm 19

The heavens herald your glory, O God, and the skies display your handiwork.

Day after day they tell their story,

And night after night they reveal the depth of their understanding.

Without speech, without words, without even an audible voice, their cry echoes through all the world, and their message reaches the ends of the earth.

For in the heavens the sun has pitched a tent. It comes forth with the grandeur of a wedding procession, with the eagerness of an athlete ready to race. It rises at one end of the sky and travels to the other end, and nothing escapes its warmth.

Your law, YHWH, is perfect; It refreshes the soul. Your rule is to be trusted; It gives wisdom to the naïve.
