 or who have sold out for money and power,
 from everything that is life destroying,
 O God, and separates us from You

Hosanna, Save Us

No wonder they told Jesus to shut His people up.
 This is language that changes the world.
 And it changes the world because God hears our cry.
 God gives God's own Self in Jesus to do what we cannot...
 and then invites us to be part of that redeeming work in the world.
 But today, this Sunday, we point to the wounds, the sins,
 the oppressions we see in ourselves and in the world around us and we cry
 out

Hosanna, Save Us.
